### **The School**

Ford End School was opened in 1872. It was originally established by the Church of England to educate the children of the parish of Ford End. Several alterations and additions have been made over the years. The building now consists of 4 well equipped classrooms, a newly refurbished



library and large indoor hall. Additionally we have fantastic outdoor facilities including a large playing field and playground, outdoor play equipment, an outdoor gym area and a purpose-built EYFS area.

Being a small school allows us to have very close relationships with our children and their families. We have strong links with the village and our local church, St John the Evangelist, which helps to strengthen our community-orientated views. Our children are respectful and tolerant of one another and have positive attitudes to their learning, both inside and outside of the classroom. The staff and governors work hard to ensure that the school personalises our approach to each pupil to ensure that everyone flourishes.

### P.E. Days

EYFS, Year 1 & Year 2 - Wednesday

Year 3 & Year 4 - Monday

Year 5 & Year 6 - Wednesday

Children are required to wear their kit for the whole day on their PE days and should therefore come to school dressed in the appropriate kit.

**Jewellery:** Jewellery is limited to wearing a wrist watch and one small, gold or silver stud in the bottom of each ear. Jewellery will need to be re-moved for PE and sports clubs. (Plasters over earrings are not permitted.) School badges, e.g. Head Boy badge, can be worn on the school uniform. No other jewellery or badges are permitted.

**Make Up:** No make-up or nail varnish is permitted.

**Hair:** Long hair needs to be tied back. Hair should be of natural colour and not extreme styles.

**Hats:** Please provide a sunhat in hot sunny weather, if required.

**Sunscreen:** Please apply to your child during hot weather, if required.

**Head Wear:** Religious items, such as hijabs, should only be worn by those of faith and should be green/black/grey.

# **Admission Arrangements**

We follow the admissions policy agreed with Essex County
Council which states that children living in the priority area at
the time of application and determination will be allocated a place at the school,
provided the application is received by the closing date. In the event of over
subscription, any remaining places will be allocated using the following criteria
in the order given:

- Looked after children
- Children with a sibling attending the school
- Remaining applications
- In the event of over subscription within any of the above criteria, priority
  will be determined by straight line distance from home to school, those
  living closest being given the highest priority.

  Exceptional medical circumstances (supported by medical
  evidence) may override the above.

Early Years Admission - Spring and Summer born children are admitted in Autumn, full time. These admissions are dealt with by Essex County Council.

Mid-year Admission – All mid-year applications are dealt with by the school. Please email admin admin@fordend.essex.sch.uk

# **The School Organisation**

Classes in our school are grouped vertically. The EYFS children are taught in a group. Year 1 and 2 are taught as a class, Year 3 and 4 are taught as a class, as are Year 5 and 6. Each child is taught at his/her own level of ability within the boundaries of the National Curriculum.

#### **SEND Information**

The school's SEND Policy is based on The Special Educational Needs Code of Practice (DfEE581 /2001). The SENDCo, class teacher and external agencies will help identify and assess the special needs of individual children. We will use all the resources available to the school, in order to meet the needs of every child and will attempt to make full use of external facilities where appropriate. The school's SEND Policy is updated annually and has regard for the Education Act 1993 and the Code of Practice on Special Needs.

#### **Attendance Information**

Government regulations require schools to keep a detailed record of pupil absence and to distinguish between authorised and unauthorised absences. For this reason it is important that you phone the school office by 9am to notify the school on the first day of absence. In the case of a medical or dental appointment, a written note must be given to the class teacher. If a child's absence falls below 90%, you will receive a note from the Headteacher to discuss the reason for the absences and to see if the school can help and support your child. A leave of absence form can be requested for extenuating circumstances; however, the school are unable to authorise absence for a family holiday.



# **Collective worship**

As we are a Church of England School, Christian Distinctiveness is evident in our vision and values. Parents have a right to withdraw their children from daily act of worship, should they feel it is inappropriate for them. Parents also have the opportunity to withdraw their child from RE lessons. Should parents wish to discuss withdrawal, they must book an appointment with the Headteacher.

#### **Homework**

Homework is provided for all children. The children are expected to read daily, as well as practice their spellings and timestables. The children will also receive a simple, weekly project. The details of each project are set out clearly on a printed sheet and will be sent home in their homework books. Children in Years 5 and 6 will also be required to complete a small amount of maths practice, as part of their homework. Homework is set on a Friday and due back the following Thursday.

# **Complaints Procedure**

The school places great emphasis on a home school partnership and hopes that all problems will be dealt with speedily by informal means. The first person to consult is the child's teacher and then the Headteacher, if the teacher is unable to rectify your concern, followed by the Hub Leader. # **School Trips, Visits and Off-Site Activities**

We aim to provide an enriched and varied curriculum, which can involve various visits to enhance your child's learning and cultural capital. We endeavour to keep the cost of these trips as manageable as possible and plenty of notice is given before the educational trip takes place. Year 5 and 6 children take part in a residential visit every two years.





#### **School Meals**

Ford End Primary is a 'Healthy School'.

Our school meals are cooked at Great Waltham School which are then delivered to Ford End. They are delicious, healthy, home cooked and comply with the latest nutrition guidelines. School meals of any kind must be ordered a week in advance. EYFS and KS 1 children receive Government funded Free School Meals. For KS2 children the cost is £2.45 each. A termly menu is available on the My Child at School app, which is where meals are also booked and paid for.

Please note, we have a strict 'no nuts' policy at Ford End School.

## **My Child at School**

We use MCAS, an online payment system, for paying for all clubs, school lunches, trips and other activities. You will also book your children's meal choices in advance through this site. We are a completely cashless school unless we are fundraising for a specific cause.

# **Clubs**

We offer a range of clubs at Ford End C of E Primary, which have included football, tennis, running, ukulele, choir and dance. Clubs change on a termly basis following feedback from the children. We endeavour to offer a wide variety of clubs to our children

All clubs are booked and paid for through the My Child at School app.



Courses are identified by the teaching staff, the School
Development Plan and at professional development meetings
and this training has a positive impact on the teaching and learning throughout the school.

Staff work closely together, both in school and across the Trust, supporting and observing each other in their professional roles as Subject Leaders.

All the Teaching Assistants and Midday Assistants are given opportunities to attend courses that support their work in school.

#### **Communication with Parents**

We regularly communicate with parents electronically. When children join the school, parents are asked to join ParentPay - this system is used to order school meals and make trip payments. Parents are encouraged to come and talk to the class teacher after school if there are any problems or concerns.

Meetings are held throughout the school year in order to plan a wide variety of different events and activities. The PTA welcome new ideas and utilise people's strengths and passions.
